Councilman Mulroy clarified misstatements made by Mrs. Metcalf in her Letter to the Editor published in The Coast Star last week, stating that he is and was objecting to the location of the loading zone on Ocean Avenue; he further explains his position opposing the loading zone and states he has always been transparent in discussing his positions on topics of concern to Borough residents.

### 4. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Ordinance No. 07-2019: The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title:
  - 1. The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title, advising of its publication in its entirety in Asbury Park Press on June 15, 2019:

ORDINANCE NO. 07-2019
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER VII, TRAFFIC, ARTICLE 7-37, LOADING ZONES, AND ARTICLE 7-39.1, HANDICAPPED PARKING, OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt has determined that the designation of a loading zone on Ocean Avenue near Beacon Boulevard is necessary to preserve and protect the safety and well-being of the general public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Sea Girt as follows:

SECTION 1. Article 7-37, LOADING ZONES, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

a. The locations described are hereby designated as Loading Zones. No person shall park a vehicle in these locations during the times indicated other than for the loading or unloading of passengers, goods and materials.

b. The Chief of Police is hereby designated to prepare a report to be presented to Council in October of each year providing an analysis of the efficacy of the Loading Zone during the previous period from May 1 through September 15, inclusive. The Council will vote annually on this matter during January of the succeeding year.

SECTION2. Article 7-39 HANDICAPPED PARKING, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

### 7-39.1 Handicapped Parking on Streets

In accordance with the provisions of *N.J.S.A.* 39:4-197, the following on street locations are designated as handicapped parking places. Such spaces are for use by persons who have been issued special identification cards or places or placed by the Motor Vehicle Commission, or a temporary placed issued by the Chief of Police. No other person shall be permitted to park in these spaces. (Ord. No. 567; Ord. No. 861; Ord. No. 13-2010 § 2)

Ocean Avenue

East

Beginning at a point 26 feet north of the northern crosswalk marking of Beacon Boulevard and extending to a point 36 feet north thereof

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

### **SECTION 5. Effective Date**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

**UPON MOTION** of Councilman Mulroy, seconded by Councilwoman Anthony, carried that the meeting be opened to the public for comments on the said Ordinance only.

Catherine Metcalf, Ocean Avenue, spoke in opposition to the location of the loading zone.

Matt Sheerin, Chicago Blvd., stated anyone can use the loading zone; parking has always been along Ocean Avenue.

Tom Schnurr, Beacon Blvd., recommends tabling the ordinance because it is not an optimal solution; loading zone is not needed 24/7.

Tom Metcalf, Ocean Avenue, thanked Council for all they do; encourages the Council to return the beachfront parking including the handicapped spaces that existed prior to loading zone approval; calling-for-the repeal of the loading zone.

Mike Sergey, Philadelphia Blvd., thanked Council for their service; he asked to return the parking spaces to the public.

**UPON MOTION** of Council President Fetzer, seconded by Councilman Mulroy, carried, the public hearing was closed.

Councilman Meixsell stated it is not fair to target Councilman Mulroy; the handicapped spot is being moved nearer the Pavilion which is closer to the ramp and allows for easier access to the Boardwalk and noted that it is used as a beach drop-off during the day for beachgoers.

Councilman Clemmensen stated the traffic engineers report supports the location on Ocean Avenue and Chief Davenport is in favor; he noted he would like to be part of the citizens committee and discussion in the fall.

Councilwoman Anthony commented that she spoke with the Chief regarding using First Avenue as loading zone; not an option at this time; should have discussion on this and other matters of concern.

Mayor Farrell commented he is trying to address public safety concerns; no Council member wants a loading zone, but we are charged with protecting the public.

**UPON MOTION** of Councilman Meixsell, seconded by Councilwoman Morris, carried, that the said Ordinance No. 07-2019 be adopted on final reading, directing the Clerk to post and publish as required by law.

B. Ordinance No. 18-2019: The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title:

**ORDINANCE NO. 18-2019:** 

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT ARTICLE 3, NOISE OF CHAPTER III, POLICE REGULATIONS OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt has determined that Article 3 of Chapter III must be revised and supplemented.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Sea Girt as follows:

SECTION 1. Article 3.1.1, Definitions, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

### 3-1.1 Definitions.

As used in this section:

- Commercial operator shall mean anyone performing construction and/or landscaping on a property other than the property owner and/or their immediate family.
- **Construction** shall mean the construction, erection, reconstruction, alteration, conversion, demolition, removal, repair, painting or equipping of buildings or structures.
- Construction equipment shall mean equipment which may be mobile, semi permanent, or permanent, intended for heavy work such as earthmoving, lifting containers or materials, drilling holes in earth or rock, or concrete or paving application.
- **Person** shall mean and include the singular and the plural and shall also mean and include any person, firm, corporation, association, club, partnership, society or any other form of association or organization.
- **Power equipment** shall mean equipment actuated by an additional power source and mechanism other than the solely manual labor used with hand tools.

**Sound-Amplifying Equipment** shall mean any machine or device for the amplification of the human voice, music or any other sound.

**Sound Truck** shall mean any type of vehicle, car, wagon, carriage or other means of transportation or locomotion, having mounted thereon or attached thereto any sound-amplifying equipment.

### **SECTION 2. 3-1.2** Noise Prohibited is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

- a. The creation of any unreasonably loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in the Borough shall be considered a nuisance and is hereby prohibited. There is further prohibited any noise of such character, intensity or duration as is detrimental to the life, health or well-being of any individual.
- b. It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue, or cause to be made or continued, or for any person to permit, allow or suffer on premises in their control, any loud, disturbing or excessive noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the limits of the Borough.
- c. No persons shall use, or cause to be used, a sound truck with its sound-amplifying equipment in operation, in the Borough.

## **SECTION 3. 3-1.3 Specific Noise Nuisances Prohibited** is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

- a. The following acts, among others, but not by way of limitation, are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this section but the following enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive:
  - 1. Horns, Signaling Devices, etc. The sounding of any horn or signaling device of any automobile, motorcycle, bus or other vehicle on any street or public place of the Borough, except as a danger warning; the creation by means of any horn or signaling device of any unreasonably loud or harsh sound, or the sounding of said horn or signaling device for any unnecessary and unreasonable period of time.
  - 2. Radios, Televisions, Amplifiers and Similar Devices. The playing, use or operation of any radio receiving set, television, musical instrument, amplifier, phonograph or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of neighboring inhabitants or with louder volume than is necessary for convenient hearing for persons who are in the room, vehicle or chamber in which the machine or device is operated and who are voluntary listeners. The operation of such a set, instrument, amplifier, phonograph, machine or device so that it is clearly audible at a distance of one hundred (100') feet from the building, structure or vehicle in which it is located shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.
  - 3. Yelling, Shouting, etc. Yelling, shouting, hooting, or singing after the hour of 10:00 p.m. and before 8:00 a.m. or at any time or place, so as to annoy and disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any office, or in any dwelling, hotel or other type of residence, or of any persons in the vicinity.

- 4. Use of power equipment not limited to landscaping equipment (including lawn mowers, blowers, edgers, clippers and saws) or construction equipment is regulated during the following times:
  - (a) Property owners and/or their immediate family members are permitted to perform construction or landscaping work between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on weekdays or between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekends and the public holidays of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.
  - (b) Commercial operators are permitted to provide their services between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on weekdays or between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays.
  - (c) Except in the case of an emergency, commercial operators are prohibited from providing their services on Sundays or on the public holidays of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Commercial operators are also prohibited from providing their services on Saturday's beginning with the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend and through Labor Day, inclusive.
- 5. Music or other amplified sound emanating from a vehicle which is plainly audible at a distance of fifty (50) feet in any direction from the vehicle.
- 6. The frequent or habitual howling, barking, meowing or other noise-making by an animal.
- b It shall be presumed that if any of the noises referred to in paragraphs a,2 and a,3 of this subsection are emanating from any building, house or yard and are audible to persons passing on the street on which such building, house or yard is located, that such noise or noises disturbs the comfort, repose and health of others and the peace of the neighborhood.

### SECTION 4. 3-1.4 Enforcement is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police, members of the Police Department and Code Enforcement Officer to determine if this section has been and is being complied with and to enforce the provisions of this section, against any person found to be violating the same. (Ord. No. 307; Ord. No. 597 § 5)

### 3-1.5 Violations and Penalties.

The Chief of Police, any Police Officer of the Borough, the Code Enforcement Officer, or any taxpayer or resident of the Borough may make complaint in the Municipal Court of the Borough of Sea Girt for any violation of this section or any subsection, or provision thereof. Unless a specific penalty is established below, any person violating any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be subject to the penalty stated in Chapter I, Section 1-5. (Ord. No. 597 § 6; Ord. No. 708 § 1; New; Ord. No. 09-2014)

**UPON MOTION** of Councilman Mulroy, seconded by Councilwoman Anthony, carried that the meeting be opened to the public for comments on the said Ordinance only.

Leann Hoffman, Philadelphia Blvd., asked if there had been a significate increase in complaints. Mayor Farrell explains the ordinance is being amended to be clearer and enforceable; Mrs. Hoffman noted the Borough shouldn't write bad laws because of a few complaints.

The following persons spoke in opposition to the adoption of the proposed Ordinance:

Tom Schnurr, Beacon Boulevard; Joe Berardo, New York Boulevard; Mark Sheerin, Chicago Boulevard; Megan Schnurr, Beacon Boulevard; Maria Reiner, Philadelphia Boulevard; Betsy Cross, Wall Township; Ray Bogan, Beacon Boulevard; Cindy Morea, New York Boulevard; Rick Reffler, Chicago Boulevard.

Sharon Kregg, Brooklyn Boulevard, spoke in favor of the Ordinance; she is opposed to the use of commercial leaf blowers in the Borough.

Robin Sweeny, Beacon Blvd. commented on ABC matters, not the said Ordinance.

**UPON MOTION** of Councilman Meixsell, seconded by Councilman Mulroy, carried, the public hearing was closed.

Councilwoman Anthony asked if the ordinance should have decibel levels as the measure; she has compared this ordinance with surrounding towns' noise ordinances. She then asked Chief Davenport the status of current summonses issued for noise complaints this season and he responded he didn't have an accurate number in front of him. He further he stated there has been an increase in noise complaints; however, to date, no citations have been issued. Mrs. Carafa explained that she has looked into the rules and regulations regarding noise ordinances; if a decibel meter is required, a state model ordinance would have to be adopted; she further stated that the Public Safety Committee has discussed the options and at the present time, is opposed to adopting (the State model) because it is not effective in a residential community. Mrs. Carafa added there aren't a lot of options in terms of the types of Ordinances that can be adopted regarding noise.

Council President Fetzer stated that there has been a noise ordinance on the books for many years; most of the provisions of this ordinance were already in effect; he suggests tabling because of many questions; he is not in favor at this time; needs to be more definitive; violations and penalties could be a problem; seems too high; he suggests tabling ordinance and revisit. Mr. Montenegro responded that the proposed provisions in the Ordinance were upheld by the Court.

Councilman Meixsell stated that the Council is trying to address issues and concerns; he would like to revisit also. Mayor Farrell noted the goal was to refine the existing ordinance.

Councilman Mulroy and Councilman Clemmensen stated that they would prefer to see this ordinance tabled.

**UPON MOTION** of Councilman Mulroy, seconded by Councilman Meixsell, carried, that the said Ordinance No. 18-2019 be *tabled* for further review.

C. Resolution No. 111-2019: Avon Hotel Corporation t/a The Parker House, request to renew Seasonal Plenary Retail Consumption License #1344-34-006-004, July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, inclusive

The Borough Attorney noted that the matter had been discussed in Executive Session held at the beginning of the meeting and the following action was recommended: Please note that Councilman Mulroy had recused himself from the Executive Session.

**UPON MOTION** of Councilman Meixsell, seconded by Council President Fetzer, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

WHEREAS, the AVON HOTEL CORPORATION, holder of seasonal retail consumption license 1344-34-006-004, has applied to the BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT to renew the license for the term of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, inclusive; and,

WHEREAS, the AVON HOTEL CORPORATION (also called the license holder in this Resolution) has paid the required Borough fee of \$1,875.00, submitted the required State fee of \$200.00 and received a Tax Clearance Certificate from the New Jersey Division of taxation for license renewal; and,

WHEREAS the license was renewed last year (July 1,2018 through June 30, 2019 inclusive) with special conditions, all consented to by the license holder; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough has received a report from the Borough Police Department that during the previous period from May 11, 2018 to September 11, 2018, Borough police responded to 633 incidents involving complaints about public urination, possession of open containers of alcohol in public, litter, excessive noise, motor vehicle operation and parking violations as well as to numerous calls from The Parker house to receive intoxicated patrons who were being ejected from the premises. The Borough Police also reported that during the period from May 1, 2019 through May 27, 2019 they responded to 118 additional incidents in the vicinity of The Parker House that involved disorderly conduct, trespassing, resisting arrest, defiant trespass and possession of prohibited drugs; and to receive intoxicated patrons who were being ejected from The Parker House, and,;

WHEREAS, members of the public have commented to the Borough Council at various public meetings during the year, that the activities in and around The Parker House have interfered with the peaceful enjoyment of their residences and continue to be a nuisance to the community; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt is a small community of approximately 1,650 residents in a mile square geographical area. The Parker House has become a major destination for consumption of alcoholic beverages by thousands of vacationers and visitors to the area. The tremendous influx of people to a licensed premise that is primarily engaged in the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on those premises, places a heavy burden on the resources of this small community; and,

WHEREAS, The Parker House has met with representatives of the Borough to confer about these complaints, most of which involve intoxicated patrons at the licensed premises, and have promised to close the main bar area on the second floor on Friday, Saturday and holiday Sunday for the 2019-2020 license term and to follow the conditions placed on the license as specifically set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt that this license is hereby renewed for the term beginning July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 inclusive, subject to the following SPECIAL CONDITIONS that have been consented to by the license holder and are deemed necessary and proper to secure compliance by the license holder with the provisions of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act, State Regulations that have been adopted by the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control and Ordinances adopted by the Borough governing the sale of Alcoholic Beverages:

### SPECIAL CONDITIONS on the license:

1. The sale or service of alcoholic beverages to patrons in the area designated as the "back porch" by the Sea Girt Bureau of Fire Prevention shall cease at eleven-thirty (11:30 PM). All alcoholic beverage containers shall be cleared from the bar and the tables on the "back porch" immediately after eleven-thirty (11:30) PM.

- 2. The license holder shall not permit overcrowding in or upon the licensed premises. Occupancy within the licensed premise shall not exceed the maximum permitted occupancy levels set by the Borough of Sea Girt's Bureau of Fire Prevention. Those levels are 334 standing persons in the Main Floor Bar Area when there is no floor space occupied by tables and chairs; 141 standing persons on the Back Porch when there is no floor space occupied by tables and chairs; 517 standing persons in the Ground floor Bar when there is no floor space occupied by tables and chairs and; 208 persons in the restaurant.
- 3. The license holder shall not violate any provision of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act and shall comply with all regulations adopted by the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control.
- 4. The license holder shall not violate any ordinance adopted by the Borough of Sea Girt pertaining to the sale, service and delivery of alcoholic beverages by persons licensed by the Borough to do so.
- 5. The license holder shall not sell, serve or deliver or allow, permit or suffer the sale, service or delivery of any alcoholic beverage, directly or indirectly, to any person actually or apparently intoxicated, or permit or suffer the consumption of any alcoholic beverage by any such person in or upon the licensed premises. A violation of this condition may result in revocation of the license.
- 6. The license holder shall operate its business in an orderly and lawful fashion, so as not to constitute a nuisance. The license holder is responsible for the conduct of employees and patrons, if such conduct is contrary to the public health, safety and welfare. A violation of this condition may result in revocation of the license.
- 7. The license holder shall require all employees who sell and/or serve alcoholic beverages to be trained in the techniques of alcohol management by the New Jersey Licensed Beverage Association, with emphasis on identifying apparently intoxicated patrons and refusing to serve alcoholic beverages to such patrons.
- 8. Those recordings shall be maintained for at least thirty (30) days and made available to the Police as requested.
- 9. The license holder shall remove trash within a four block radius of the licensed premises immediately after closing at night and prior to opening for the day.
- 10. The license holder shall post a security employee among the persons waiting to enter to reduce passing identification documents from one patron to another. The license holder shall post crowd control security employees on the exterior of the licensed premises on Fridays, Saturdays and holiday Sundays from 9:00 PM until all patrons have left the premises, so as to insure that patrons leave the premises in an orderly fashion. The licensee shall require all employees including security employees to wear shirts clearly identifying them as "Parker House Staff".
- 11. Patrons waiting outside the premises for admission shall be required by the license holder to wait in a single line, quietly and in an orderly fashion.
- 12. The license holder shall maintain plexiglass covers installed over the windows on the west side of the lower level of the licensed premises.
- 13. The license holder shall maintain a plexiglass, double-door enclosure system installed at the west side, lower level entry.
