5. OPEN DISCUSSION -

Councilwoman Anthony thanked Anthony Garofalo of Shore Home Builders who donated a large number of plantings from the former Matthews property to the Borough; she also thanked CTC Landscaping and numerous volunteers for their efforts in the beautification of the town; she added she hopes to see more beautification efforts in the near future.

Councilman Mulroy proposed a modification to Ordinance 12-2018 that the said Ordinance be reviewed and voted annually; Councilmembers support the modifications and the Ordinance will be prepared for discussion on May 22nd.

Mayor Farrell read the following statement –

In response to the recent press releases issued by the Parker House with regard to their past liquor license renewals, the Borough Council desires that the residents of Sea Girt should know that some of the information provided is not completely accurate and that the Borough has always proceeded and acted in good faith with regard to its residents and the Parker House and will continue to do so.

With regard to concerns that the Parker House or residents may have with regard to the Parker House operation, please be advised that the renewal hearing is tentatively scheduled for the first meeting in June at which time everyone having an interest in the Parker House will be able to provide testimony as to their position relative to the Parker House operation.

The Borough Council welcomes any and all comments at the renewal hearing, June 12 at 7:00 PM.

6. OLD BUSINESS

A. Resolution No. 74-2019: Authorize Sale of Excess Public Property

Mayor Farrell announced the change from Ordinance to Resolution noting that this matter was introduced at the April 10, 2019 meeting as Ordinance No. 14-2019. Since then, guidance received from the Borough Attorney clarified that the sale of excess public property can be authorized via a Resolution. He further stated that the proceeds from the sale are intended to be used for the Library renovations and beautification fund.

Councilman Mulroy concurred with the Mayor's comments also noting that there is a need to designate an amount from the proceeds of the sale to beautification efforts.

UPON MOTION of Councilman Meixsell, seconded by Councilwoman Morris, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(a) authorizes a governmental unit to sell any real property, not needed for public use, by open public sale at auction to the highest bidder, after the required advertisements subject to the following terms and conditions hereinafter set forth pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough is the owner of real property identified as Block 81, Lot 1 ("the Property") on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Sea Girt; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that the property is not needed for public use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, New Jersey, as follows:

- (a) The Governing Body hereby declares that the property is no longer needed for public use (vacant) and shall be sold in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-13(a), et seq.
- (b) There shall be an open public sale at auction on a date and time to be determined by the Borough Council at the Borough of Sea Girt Municipal Building, 321 Baltimore Boulevard, Sea Girt, NJ 08750, where the property shall be offered to the highest bidder pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-13(a).

The Borough hereby designates Lorraine P. Carafa, Business Administrator, or such other person the Borough Administrator designates to conduct the sale of the parcel.

Bids may be submitted, in writing, in advance of the auction or interested persons may attend the auction to present bids.

- (c) The Borough shall sub-divide the existing Lot 1 consisting of 27,241 sq. ft. into two (2) lots as follows: Lot 1.01, 15,617 sq. ft.; Lot 1.02, 11,662 sq. ft. pursuant to the survey prepared by the firm of Leon S. Avakian, Inc. The minimum bid for Lot 1.01 shall be nine hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$950,000); the minimum bid for Lot 1.02 shall be nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000).
- (d) Pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-13(a), the Borough of Sea Girt shall either accept the highest responsible bid or reject all bids. No bid shall be fully accepted until the passage of a Resolution by the Borough Council as set forth herein.
- (e) The successful bidder shall be required to deposit ten (10%) percent of his or her bid with the Borough at the time of the auction. This deposit shall be made by a certified check, money order or cash in an amount equal to at least ten (10%) percent of the accepted bid by the Borough for the sale of the property. The combined form of deposit must equal ten (10%) percent of the total sale price. All monies so received will be credited to the total sale price, with the remaining monies due on delivery of the Deed.

- (f) The Borough disclaims any and all implied warranties of habitability or usability with respect to the parcel. The highest bidder shall purchase the parcel in an "as is" condition, having had ample and sufficient opportunity to inspect said premises, examine its title, and review municipal ordinances and laws affecting the Parcel. The Borough makes no representation regarding the property as to its character, value, quality, habitability or environmental conditions. The highest bidder, after closing, shall be responsible for all defects of any kind in the parcel. This agreement shall survive the closing of title.
- (g) Non-Refundable Deposit. The deposit made by the purchaser is non-refundable. The purchaser is not entitled to a refund of this deposit in any case and the risk of loss is on the purchaser.
- (h) All bidders must appear in person at the auction or by sealed bid and any person bidding on behalf of a corporation or limited liability company must either submit a copy of a resolution of the corporation/company or a letter on corporate stationery, signed by an officer of the corporation, authorizing the bidder to bid on the property on the corporation's behalf. A person bidding on behalf of a partnership or using a trade name must submit a copy of the certificate of trade name and a letter of authorization from the other partners. No other bidder may submit a bid on behalf of another, except that a husband or wife may bid on behalf of both.
- (i) The successful bidder, within two weeks of the conclusion of the bidding, shall execute an Agreement of Sale. The balance of the purchase price shall be paid at closing which shall occur not later than sixty (60) days following the acceptance of the bid by the Borough. The purchaser shall be entitled to possession immediately following closing of title.
- (j) The sale price, as may result from this auction sale, may not be used before any County Board of Taxation, State Tax Court or in any other court of this State to challenge the assessment with respect to the subject property nor may same be used as a comparable sale to challenge the assessment with regard to other properties.
- (k) "All conveyances by the Borough shall be made by bargain and sale deed and such conveyances shall carry deed restrictions that indicate A) that no further subdivision of either lot shall be permitted and B) that both lots shall only be used for residential purposes."
- (1) The highest bid shall be accepted or rejected by resolution of the Governing Body no later than the second regular meeting of the Governing Body following the date of such auction sale.

(m) The successful bidder agrees that:

- (1) The property is located in Zone 1E (single family, residential) and the successful bidder shall comply with the requirements of the zone as stated in the Borough's Development Ordinances.
- (2) He or she shall indemnify and hold the Borough harmless from any claim whatsoever arising out of the Borough's ownership interest including but not limited to environmental cleanup costs.
- (3) He or she shall pay prorated real estate taxes for the balance of the current year, as of the date of closing.

- (4) He or she shall abide by all appropriate zoning, subdivision, health and building regulations and codes and stipulations that this sale will not be used as grounds to support a challenge of the existing assessment of the subject property, nor shall the purchase price be used as a comparable sale to challenge assessments with regard to other properties.
- (5) Failure to close title as agreed shall forfeit to the Borough of Sea Girt any and all money deposited with the Borough.
- (n) A failure by the purchaser to fully comply with the terms, conditions, requirements and regulations of sale as herein contained shall be considered, at the option of the Borough of Sea Girt, as a material breach of the conditions of sale whereupon the Borough may declare said contract or purchase terminated and at an end. All monies paid on behalf of the purchase price, by way of deposit or otherwise, may be retained by the Borough as its liquidated damages and it may thereafter resell said property and/or pursue such other and further legal and/or equitable remedies as it may have and the defaulting purchaser shall continue to remain liable for all damages and losses sustained by the Borough of Sea Girt by reason of any such default.
- (o) The sale is made subject to all applicable laws and ordinances of the State of New Jersey and the Borough of Sea Girt.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Borough Clerk, as required by *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12-13(a), shall advertise the open public sale at auction of the Property in a newspaper circulating in the municipality in which the Property is situated, by two insertions at least once a week during two consecutive weeks, the last publication to be not earlier than seven days prior to such sale.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Mayor, Clerk, Borough Attorney and such other officials as may be necessary are authorized to perform such ministerial actions as are necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution including, but not limited to, preparing and executing a deed and all other necessary documents to convey the Property to the successful bidder, subsequent to the Governing Body adopting a resolution awarding the bid.

B. Ordinance No. 13-2019: The Mayor read the said Ordinance by Title:

ORDINANCE NO. 13-2019 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER VII, TRAFFIC, ARTICLE 7-39.1, HANDICAPPED PARKING, OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Sea Girt as follows:

SECTION 1. Article 7-39 HANDICAPPED PARKING, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

7-39.1 Handicapped Parking on Streets.

In accordance with the provisions of *N.J.S.A.* 39:4-197, the following on street locations are designated as handicapped parking places. Such spaces are for use by persons who have been issued special identification cards or plates or placards by the Motor Vehicle Commission, or a temporary placard issued by the Chief of Police. No other person shall be permitted to park in these spaces. (Ord. No. 567; Ord. No. 861; Ord. No. 13-2010 § 2)

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 5. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

7. NEW BUSINESS

A. ORDINANCES - introduction

a. **Ordinance No. 05-2019:** The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title and explained that the purpose of the Ordinance is to require a retaining wall be erected when an excavation is within ten (10) feet of another structure or driveway.

ORDINANCE NO. 05-2019

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT SECTION 12-2, CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURE AND SITE REGULATION, SUBSECTION 12-2.2 ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS OF CHAPTER XII, BUILDING AND HOUSING IN THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

Councilman Meixsell noted the intent of the Ordinance is to protect properties; he added that pools should be excluded from the requirement, requesting a ten (10) foot.

Mr. Hall, Chairman of the Planning Board supports excavation within ten (10) feet of another structure as well as deleting the word "shoring" and replacing it with the words "retaining wall".

After further discussion and **UPON MOTION** of Councilman Meixsell, seconded by Councilman Mulroy, carried, by consensus that the following Ordinance be amended to propose changing Section 2. 1. "from within fifteen feet..." to "within ten (10) feet of a structure or driveway" and also to amend Section 2. b. to delete the word "shoring" and replace it with the words "retaining wall".

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 12-2.2(a) Definitions is hereby supplemented as follows:

Retaining Wall, Steel or wood pile walls are constructed by driving steel sheets or timber into a slope or excavation up to the required depth. Their most common use is within temporary deep excavations. They are considered to be most economical where retention of higher earth pressures of soft soils is required.

SECTION 2. Section 12-2.2, *Additional Regulations*, is hereby supplemented as follows:

- 1. Subsection o. All excavations equal to or greater than five (5) feet deep and five (5) wide must include the installation of retaining wall to provide temporary support of soil and existing structures.
 - 1. Any excavation within ten (10) feet of a structure or driveway throughout the project shall be supported in such a manner that no caving will result from the excavations and that no driveway, structure or public or private property outside the project limits will be damaged. A sloped area no larger than fifteen (15') in width may be left open at the front of the excavation to allow for equipment access into the excavation.

- 2. The property owner shall submit signed and sealed plans for the shoring, designed by an engineer licensed in the State of New Jersey and shall be included with the application for zoning approval.
- 2. Subsection p. The requirement of Subsection o, the retaining wall of an excavation shall be waived upon the submission of a written agreement, witnessed by a notary public licensed by the State of New Jersey, between the owner of the site upon which the construction will occur and the owners of properties adjacent to the side and rear setbacks of the site upon which the construction will occur. Said Agreement must be submitted to the Zoning Official of the Borough prior to the commencement of any construction activity. The requirements of Subsection "o" shall remain in full force and effect if the written agreement(s) between all the parties is not submitted prior to the commencement of construction.

SECTION 3. Violations and penalties. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction, be subject to the penalties as provided in Chapter 1, Section 1-5 entitled "General Penalty." Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

UPON MOTION of Councilwoman Anthony, seconded by Councilman Mulroy, carried, that the said Ordinance be and the same is hereby adopted *as amended* on first reading, direction the Clerk to post and publish as required by law and setting the date of the public hearing as May 22, 2019.

b. Ordinance No 15-2019: The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title:

ORDINANCE NO.15-2019

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER XII, BUILDING, AND HOUSING, ARTICLE 12, CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURES AND SITE REGULATIONS, OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt as follows:

SECTION 1. Article 12-2.2(j), Additional Regulations is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

- j. Construction is permitted during the following times:
 - 1. Construction Hours Permitted.

Monday through Friday—8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Saturday—9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Except in the case of an emergency, no commercial construction shall take place on Sundays or on the public holidays of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, but is permitted on those days if done solely by the property owner and/or their immediate family between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Commercial construction is also prohibited on Saturdays beginning on the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend in May and ending on Labor Day, inclusive, but is permitted if done solely by the property owner and/or their immediate family between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

- 2. Use of Power Tools. The use of power equipment or tools by both commercial operators and property owners for construction, repair or alteration of buildings, landscaping and lawn maintenance is permitted during the following times:
 - (a) Mondays through Fridays, (except on the public holidays of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas), between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
 - (b) On Saturdays between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. (Except the provision of services by commercial operators is not permitted on Saturdays beginning on the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend in May and ending on Labor Day, inclusive,) Individual property owners and/or their immediate family members are permitted to perform construction and/or landscaping work on all Saturdays, Sundays and the public holidays of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

SECTION 4. Violations and penalties. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction, be subject to the penalties as provided in Chapter 1, Section 1-5 entitled "General Penalty." Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 5. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after adoption and final publication as required by law.

A. Resolution No. 76-2019: Authorizing Refund of Sewer Tap Fee, Kenmar Development, LLC, \$4,200 (existing tap was utilized)

B. Resolution No. 77-2019: Authorize lease with New York SMSA Limited Partnership dba Verizon Wireless, 5 year initial term with renewal option, \$30,000 initial annual rent, increasing 3% per year thereafter.

Councilwoman Anthony asked that the lessee provide additional landscaping to shield the properties in the surrounding area if necessary.

12. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON ANY SUBJECT (Comments limited to 7 minutes)

Lynn Ward, Sea Girt Avenue, thanked Councilmembers for introducing Ordinance No. 05-2019 but would also like to see a new Ordinance restricting excavation within two feet of property line; she would also like to see six (6) foot setbacks.

Tess Manley and Brian Manley commented on the perceived lack of effort by the Borough Council to control operations at the Parker House including the placement of equipment in the "parking area" without permits and unenforced Ordinance violations including playing music past 10 PM, having a line extending east along Beacon Boulevard that is obstructing the sidewalk and enumerated bad behavior by patrons of the Parker House that are disturbing to the neighbors, including yelling loudly, urinating in public, carrying open containers and other behaviors that prevent the neighbors from the peaceful

enjoyment of their properties; they both stated that they do not want The Parker House to close, just contain their operations on their property and be a better neighbor;

Mark Sheerin, Chicago Boulevard, stated that he supports The Parker House;

Megan Reider, Beacon Boulevard commented on dangerous traffic conditions associated with taxis operating on Borough streets. She proposed a 10 mph speed limit in the vicinity of The Parker House and further noted that she does not want The Parker House to close; she wants safety for residents and visitors.

Joseph Berardo, New York Boulevard, commented that he lives next to the Firehouse and deals with the fire horn loudly sounding at all hours of the day and night; he also stated that he know what he was getting when he built his home near the Fire House. He also noted that Council and The Parker House have tried to accommodate both sides. Mr. Berardo further commented on The Parker House operation and noted that he supports its operation.

Roger McLaughlin, Esq., stated that he represents the owners of The Parker House and noted that decisions have been made to improve its operation to include closing the upstairs main bar and TV bar area on Fridays, Saturdays and holiday Sundays; thus reducing the occupancy by 27%. Mr. McLaughlin also proposed a drop off zone on First Avenue, stating that The Parker House never asked for the drop-off zone to be located on Ocean Avenue. Mr. McLaughlin then stated that he was in contact with Freeholder Arnone, County Sheriff and the County Engineer and they are open to a meeting to discuss the location of the drop-off zone. He further commented that The Parker House is offering to fund police services necessary to man the drop-off zone if it is relocated to First Avenue.

Candice Kadimik, Beacon Boulevard, noted she would like Mr. McLaughlin to speak with the neighbors of The Parker House before suggesting that the drop-off zone be moved to First Avenue. She recounted the history of The Parker House and concluded by stating that she doesn't want The Parker House to close despite its (The Parker House) violations of many of the conditions imposed on the license. She further demanded that Council enforce the laws of the town.

Catherine Metcalf, Ocean Avenue, read from a petition that she prepared demanding the elimination of the drop-off zone on Ocean Avenue and returning the eleven parking spots; she also objected to the operations of The Parker House, stating that she doesn't want them to close, she wants them to be a good neighbor.

Doug Twyman, Beacon Boulevard, supports the operation of The Parker House,

Chip Sweeney, Beacon Boulevard, opposes the loading zone on Ocean Avenue.

Kelly Mulroy, Beacon Boulevard thanked Mayor and Council for their efforts; she opposes the loading zone on Ocean Avenue; it causes havoc and it's dangerous; she noted the intent was good, but the execution is wrong.

Robin Sweeney, Beacon Boulevard opposes the drop-off zone on Ocean Avenue and she supports The Parker House.

Joe Griffin, New York Boulevard supports The Parker House; he noted it's an organized and controlled organization; noting that Council must represent all residents of the Borough and it is his opinion that most people support The Parker House.

Patricia Sheerin, Chicago Boulevard, supports The Parker House; she stated that there were lines to get into The Parker House 25 years ago.

Eileen Devlin, Beacon Boulevard, stated that the solutions presented by Mr. McLaughlin should be discussed and strongly suggested that the parties engage in mediation.

Megan Pacetti, Washington Boulevard, noted that we all want the best for Sea Girt; social media is a problem; parking lot should be used for vehicles; she doesn't want to see The Parker House close but it does need to be reined in a bit.

There being no further comments, Mayor Farrell closed the public comments. There being no further business, and **UPON MOTION** of Councilman Meixsell, seconded by Councilman Mulroy, carried, that the meeting be finally adjourned at 9:35 PM.

More than the items we lend




Programs for adults_include the monthly Book Club, quarterly Cookbook Club (held on an evening when the library is closed so it can be the sole focus of the evening), Book Recommendation programs with the librarians, trips to NYC to see Broadway shows, and custom planned trips such as tours of the Philadelphia Museum of Art. Author presentations and programs on organization, health & wellness and music have also been popular and sometimes stretch the room we have available.


Programs for children include weekly Story Times with crafts, monthly music and dance programs, and monthly visits with trained therapy dogs. Special events include magic shows (photo below), Books & Bites (story time followed by creation of a food mentioned in the book), and People in Our Neighborhood series for pre-school age children where members of the rescue, police and fire companies visit with their vehicles and talk about their services. In July and August there is an additional weekly Story Time held on the boardwalk at the beach. Many special programs are Standing Room Only.

School students and summer campers make field trips to the library each year, and we are told this is a much-loved destination. It fills our hearts with joy when before and after special programs (and occasionally during) the children pull a book from our shelves and sit down to read.







Library Staff and Volunteers

Sea Girt Library operates under the direction of two paid employees (a director and an assistant director) plus 25 dedicated volunteers. The library started in 1992 with Librarian Anne Ryan and about 10 volunteers, some of whom still work with us. 

Philanthropic Support

Sea Girt Library is also supported by our town philanthropically. Friends of the Sea Girt Library was established in 2015 as a 501©3 organization so that donations may be tax deductible. The Friends have raised \$65,000 with the intent of financing some of the needs when the library is expanded. The Friends also support the costs of several special programs on an ongoing basis. The annual Wine and Cheese celebration, our main fundraising event, has been consistently well-attended. The Friends recently established an Amazon Smile account where Amazon donates a small percentage of each sale to designated charities. In addition, annual gifts to the library continue to grow, and are recognized on our Leadership donor board (see below).



This donor board features a photograph of our first and greatest benefactor, Sara Zock, whose dedication to a vibrant town library has never been forgotten.

Future of the Library

Libraries are a good example of "third spaces," a relatively new term coined by Sociologist Ray Oldenburg, referring to places where people spend time other than home and work ("first" and "second" places). These are low-cost places where people socialize and share interests. Our patrons tell us that socializing is a key factor to why they visit the library.

We have put an emphasis on providing a variety of programs for adults and children in the past few years, and several have stretched the limits of our gathering room. STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) projects for school students have proven extremely popular. Our Cookbook Club for adults has reached capacity for certain meetings, and we are usually standing room only for the special summer programs. We have a large weekly following for Story Time and crafts Thursday mornings. It is our goal to expand the library to increase the gathering room space.

Another growing use at libraries is technology. We have one public desktop computer and two laptop computers are in the process of being donated to us. In addition to having the computers available for public use, two high school students offer tech support a few days each week. Our elderly patrons particularly appreciate this service.

The library staff has worked tirelessly to create a welcoming environment for patrons to congregate. The shelves not filled with books feature an assortment of historical photographs of the town of Sea Girt and the train station. All residents and guests are enthusiastically invited to visit our much-loved library.


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



Existing Floor Plan




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
Proposed First Floor Plan






