MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING SEPTEMBER 28, 2016

The Regular Meeting of the Borough of Sea Girt Council was called to order by Mayor F. Ken Farrell at 7:30 PM on Wednesday, September 28, 2016, at the Sea Girt Elementary School, Bell Place, Sea Girt. Mayor Farrell asked for a moment of silence and then led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Clerk read the Compliance Statement: this meeting is called pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, PL 1975, Section 5: adequate notice of this meeting has been given by posting the Notice on the Borough Bulletin Board and by transmitting the Notice to the Borough's two newspapers, *The Asbury Park Press* and *The Coast Star*, as required by law.

2. PRESENTATION – The Terrace Rehabilitation Project by Borough Engineer Peter R. Avakian

Mayor Farrell explained the Terrace Rehabilitation Project and noted important factors that were considered when developing the design for the proposed improvements: limiting the weight of vehicles, limiting the volume of traffic and reducing the speed of traffic on The Terrace. He then introduced Peter. Avakian, the Borough Engineer, who further discussed the matter and offered some background on the Committee's discussions, including possibly paying the road. Mr. Avakian identified drainage issues as a major contributing factor leading to deterioration of the road surface. Mr. Ayakian also discussed permitting requirements and noted that there is currently no sub-base or drainage. The proposed rehabilitation will include a sixteen (16') foot wide travelway with curbing of either Belgian block or concrete; curbing is absolutely necessary to help retain the gravel on the road surface and stop it from migrating to adjacent areas. He noted Belgian block is more resilient and easier to replace than concrete curbing, however, it is also a more expensive alternative. Mr. Avakian explained the power point presentation (see a copy attached to the Minutes). For drainage improvements, the suggestions include the installation of underground recharge basins with inlets installed on either side of the road; soil borings would be necessary to determine how deep the basins have to be. Based on Chief Davenport's suggestions, the Borough would also reconfigure traffic flow to west to east and limit traffic to local traffic only, creating a local collector road. Mayor Farrell commented that the Committee discussed the option to close The Terrace between Second and Third Avenues, but eliminated that option from the final proposed plan. Councilperson Mulroy asked that another factor to consider is the possible use of The Terrace by people hoping to avoid backup's at Beacon Blvd. Mr. Avakian noted that much thought and consideration has gone into this project including improving sub grade, create stable roadway surface and install drainage. The cost of the project is estimated to be \$450,000 to \$500,000.

Councilperson Rotolo asked for an estimate of the annual maintenance cost for the paved surface as opposed to the unpaved surface: Mr. Avakian advised that in the year's following the rehabilitation, the cost should run approximately \$5,000 to \$10,000 annually; with \$10,000 to \$15,000 every five years or so. Paved roads do not generally require much maintenance.

Council President Fetzer asked if this design included gutters; Mr. Avakian advised that this is to be determined during preparation of final design.

Councilperson Rotolo asked why porous pavement is recommended. Mr. Avakian responded due that porous pavement would allow for greater absorption of runoff into the drainage system. Council President Fetzer noted that installation and maintenance of porous pavement is problematic if not done correctly and questioned life expectancy of the (gravel) surface, noting that every five years there is a greater expense to the Borough.

Councilperson Foley suggested closing the road completely at Ocean Avenue, thereby prohibiting through traffic.

The Administrator advised that the power point presentation will be posted on website and included with these Minutes.

Mayor Farrell thanked Mr. Avakian for his presentation and advised that the meeting would be opened to the public for comments on this matter only. The following persons commented:

Jerry Roberts, The Terrace, questioned with the roads expanding 16' would that involve removing trees? Mr. Avakian noted no trees would be removed; Mr. Robert asked how much of his property will be taken for this project? Mr. Avakian explains first 40' to the south of the road is Borough property; drainage basins will be installed at the low spot of each block.

Ms. Flynn, The Terrace, asked to consider the traffic flow; noted that cars are going wrong the way on the street. Mayor Farrell said we cannot avoid all traffic risks. Chief Davenport noted that a contributing factor to this is the closure of the road between Second and Third Avenues, and noted that this problem should diminish with the changed traffic flow and open road.

Bruce Johnson, The Terrace, commented that there are three or four threes that should be removed; he has no problem changing the flow of traffic; he suggested increasing the number of drainage structures; and noted that he is not in favor of bluestone.

John O'Grady, The Terrace, asked what color of stone; Mr. Avakian responded that it is bluestone; Mr. O'Grady said he doesn't want bluestone; he likes Belgian block; not in favor of changing traffic flow.

There being no further comments, the Council thanked Mr. Avakian for his presentation and noted that a final decision would be acted upon at the next Council meeting.

A. Resolution No. 188-2016: Resolution determining the form and other details of not exceeding \$4,356,000 Bonds, Series 2016, of The Borough of Sea Girt in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey, and Providing for their Sale to the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust and the State of New Jersey Pursuant to the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing Program.

UPON MOTION of Councilperson Foley, seconded by Council President Fetzer, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt (the "Local Unit"), in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Local Unit to construct the Project (the "Project") as defined in each of that certain Loan Agreement (the "Trust Loan Agreement") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust (the "Trust") and that certain Loan Agreement (the "Fund Loan Agreement", and together with the Trust Loan Agreement, the "Loan Agreements") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (the "State"), all pursuant to the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing Program (the "Program");

WHEREAS, the Local Unit has determined to finance the acquisition, construction, renovation or installation of the Project with the proceeds of a loan to be made by each of the Trust (the "Trust Loan") and the State (the "Fund Loan", and together with the Trust Loan, the "Loans") pursuant to the Trust Loan Agreement and the Fund Loan Agreement, respectively;

WHEREAS, to evidence the Loans, each of the Trust and the State require the Local Unit to authorize, execute, attest and deliver the Local Unit's General Obligation Bonds, Series 2016-A, to the Trust, in an aggregate principal amount of approximately \$1,130,000 (the "Trust Loan Bond") and General Obligation Bonds, Series 2016-B, to the State, in an aggregate principal of approximately \$3,226,000 (the "Fund Loan Bond", and together with the Trust Loan Bond, the "Local Unit Bonds") in a total aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$4,356,000, pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey (the "Local Bond Law"), other applicable law and the Loan Agreements; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law allows for the sale of the Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond to the Trust and the State, respectively, without any public offering, and N.J.S.A. 58:11B-9(a) allows for the sale of the Trust Loan Bond to the Trust without any public offering, all under the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by a 2/3 vote of the full membership of the governing body of the Local Unit as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A;2-27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law and N.J.S.A. 58:11B-9(a), the Local Unit hereby sells and awards its Trust Loan Bond to the Trust and its Fund Loan Bond to the State, in a total aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$4,356,000, all in accordance with the provisions hereof. The Local Unit Bonds have been referred to and are described in bond ordinance #09-2015 of the Local Unit, which bond ordinance was finally adopted by the Local Unit at a meeting duly called and held on February 25, 2015, at which time a quorum was present and acted throughout, all pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law.

- **Section 2.** The Chief Financial Officer of the Local Unit (the "Chief Financial Officer") is hereby authorized to determine, in accordance with the Local Bond Law and pursuant to the terms and conditions established by the Trust and the State under the Loan Agreements and the terms and conditions hereof, the following items with respect to the Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond:
 - (a) The aggregate principal amounts of the Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond to be issued:
 - (b) The maturity and annual principal installments of the Local Unit Bonds, which maturity shall not exceed 20 years;
 - (c) The date of the Local Unit Bonds;
 - (d) The interest rates of the Local Unit Bonds;
 - (e) The purchase price for the Local Unit Bonds; and
 - (f) The terms and conditions under which the Local Unit Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities.
- Section 3. Any determination made by the Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the terms hereof shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and attestation of the Local Unit Bonds by the parties authorized under Section 4(c) hereof.
- Section 4. The Local Unit hereby determines that certain terms of the Local Unit Bonds shall be as follows:
 - (a) The Trust Loan Bond shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered T-A1. The Fund Loan Bond shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered F-B1;
 - (b) The Local Unit Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form and shall be payable to the registered owners thereof as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America; and
 - (c) The Local Unit Bonds shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer under official seal or facsimile thereof affixed, printed, engraved or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Local Unit Clerk.
- **Section 5.** The Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond shall be substantially in the form set forth in the Trust Loan Agreement and the Fund Loan Agreement, respectively.
- Section 6. The law firm of Davison, Eastman & Muñoz P.A. is hereby authorized to arrange for the printing of the Local Unit Bonds, which law firm may authorize McCarter & English, LLP, bond counsel to the Trust and the State for the Program, to arrange for same. The Local Unit auditor is hereby authorized to prepare the financial information necessary in connection with the issuance of the Local Unit Bonds. The Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer and the Local Unit Clerk are hereby authorized to execute any certificates necessary or desirable in connection with the financial and other information.

- **Section 7.** The terms of the Local Unit Bonds authorized to be set forth by the Chief Financial Officer in accordance with Section 2 hereof shall be ratified by the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the full membership of the governing body of the Local Unit.
- Section 8. The Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer are hereby severally authorized to execute any certificates or documents necessary or desirable in connection with the sale of the Local Unit Bonds, and are further authorized to deliver same to the Trust and the State upon delivery of the Local Unit Bonds and the receipt of payment therefor in accordance with the Loan Agreements.
 - **Section 9.** This resolution shall take effect immediately.
- Section 10. Upon the adoption hereof, the Local Unit Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution to Davison, Eastman & Muñoz, bond counsel to the Local Unit, and Richard T. Nolan, Esq., McCarter & English, LLP, bond counsel to the Trust.

Resolution No. 189-2016: Resolution of the Borough of Sea Girt in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey authorizing the execution and delivery of loan agreements to be executed by the Borough of Sea Girt and each of the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the Department of Environmental Protection, and further authorizing the execution and delivery of an Escrow Agreement, all pursuant to the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing Program.

UPON MOTION of Councilperson Foley, seconded by Councilperson Mulroy, carried, that the following Resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the Borough of Sea Girt (the "Local Unit"), in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Local Unit to construct the Project (the "Project") as defined in each of that certain Loan Agreement (the "Trust Loan Agreement") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust (the "Trust") and that certain Loan Agreement (the "Fund Loan Agreement", and together with the Trust Loan Agreement, the "Loan Agreements") to be entered into by and between the Local Unit and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (the "State"), all pursuant to the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing Program (the "Program");

WHEREAS, to evidence the Loans, each of the Trust and the State require the Local Unit to authorize, execute, attest and deliver the Local Unit's General Obligation Bonds, Series 2016-A, to the (the "Trust Loan Bond") and General Obligation Bonds, Series 2016-B, to the State (the "Fund Loan Bond", and together with the Trust Loan Bond, the "Local Unit Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$4,356,000 pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey (the "Local Bond Law"), other applicable law and the Loan Agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Trust and the State have expressed their desire to close in escrow the making of the Loans, the issuance of the Local Unit Bonds and the execution and delivery of the Loan Agreements, all pursuant to the terms of an Escrow Agreement (the "Escrow Agreement") to be entered into by and among the Trust, the State, the Local Unit and the escrow agent named therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Local Unit as follows:

Section 1. The Trust Loan Agreement, the Fund Loan Agreement and the Escrow Agreement (collectively, the "Financing Documents") are hereby authorized to be executed and delivered on behalf of the Local Unit by either the Mayor or the Chief Financial Officer in substantially the forms attached hereto as Exhibits A, B and C, respectively, with such changes as the Mayor or the Chief Financial Officer (each an "Authorized Officer"), in their respective sole discretion, after consultation with counsel and any advisors to the Local Unit (collectively, the "Local Unit Consultants") and after further consultation with the Trust, the State and their representatives, agents, counsel and advisors (collectively, the "Program Consultants", and together with the Local Unit Consultants, the "Consultants"), shall determine, such determination to be conclusively evidenced by the execution of such Financing Documents by an Authorized Officer as determined hereunder. The Local Unit Clerk is hereby authorized to attest to the execution of the Financing Documents by an Authorized Officer of the Local Unit as determined hereunder and to affix the corporate seal of the Local Unit to such Financing Documents.

Section 2. The Authorized Officers of the Local Unit are hereby further severally authorized to (i) execute and deliver, and the Local Unit Clerk is hereby further authorized to attest to such execution and to affix the corporate seal of the Local Unit to, any document, instrument or closing certificate deemed necessary, desirable or convenient by the Authorized Officers or the Local Unit Clerk, as applicable, in their respective sole discretion, after consultation with the Consultants, to be executed in connection with the execution and delivery of the Financing Documents and the consummation of the transactions contemplated thereby, which determination shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution of each such certificate or other document by the party authorized hereunder to execute such certificate or other document, and (ii) perform such other actions as the Authorized Officers deem necessary, desirable or convenient in relation to the execution and delivery thereof.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

In the event there is a conflict between these rules and any collective bargaining agreement, personnel services contract or Federal or State law, the terms and conditions of that contract or law shall prevail. In all other cases, these policies and procedures shall prevail.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this manual is intended to provide guidelines covering public service by Borough employees and is not a contract. The provisions of this manual may be amended and supplemented from time to time without notice and at the sole discretion of the Borough Council

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to the maximum extent permitted by law, employment practices for the Borough of Sea Girt shall operate under the legal doctrine known as "employment at will."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Administrator and all managerial/supervisory personnel are responsible for these employment practices. The Administrator and the Labor Attorney shall assist the Administrator in the implementation of the policies and procedures in this manual.






Existing Road Surface











Proposed Road Surface

Roadway Cross Section




SLOPED BELGIAN BLOCK CURB DETAIL





- Not visually appealing.




Sloped Concrete Curb

Underground Recharge Basin


- Underground recharge basins will be installed to collect rainfall runoff from the roadway surface for recharge into the ground.
