14. ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS/DISCUSSION

- a. Carriage Way consensus is necessary the road has been temporarily stabilized for now by DPW; the lowest responsible quote to further stabilize the road *temporarily* is \$17,200; I am awaiting the estimate on the full rehabilitation and installation of curbing as recommended by our Engineer, approximate cost is \$250,000. Do we proceed with another temporary stabilization or put this out to bid for the comprehensive rehabilitation?
- b. Outfall and Infrastructure Improvement Project contractor has been on-site consistently since January 27; Baltimore Blvd. coffer dam has been rebuilt but weather is hampering construction of outfall; installation of new storm drainage infrastructure along Baltimore Blvd. was completed earlier than anticipated and completion of tie in to First Avenue that was expected to take until March 19 is now estimated to be completed by March 11. The Neptune coffer dam construction is delayed by the discovery of jetty rock along the northern side where the coffer dam was originally proposed to be constructed so revised location has to be determined. Both our Engineer and I have reinforced in all communications with the contractor that work must be completed by May 15. Sea Girt has requested and County has agreed to 50/50 split of costs for infrastructure work, estimated to be a maximum of \$537,163, subject to completion of project and submittal of as-built quantity and final costs.

- c. Neptune, Seaside and Morven Terrace Rehabilitation after inspecting the existing storm drain, the determination by our Engineer is that the least costly and most effective method to solve the condition issues is the replacement of the pipe in kind. If we go out to bid in mid-March, the probable mobilization will put the infrastructure phase of the project going occurring during the late June-July time frame, with paving in late Fall; otherwise, this becomes a Fall 2016 utility project with paving in the Spring of 2017. Consensus is necessary before we go out to bid. Infrastructure cost estimate is approximately \$512,000. I am in contact with the NJEIT requesting a determination if some of these costs can be financed with the Outfall and Infrastructure Improvement Project.
- d. **Site Remediation Update** –ERFS has advised that an additional treatment scheduled for March was performed on March 3; we are awaiting a response to the RFP for LSRP services.
- e. **Recreation News** Annual Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for Saturday, March 19 at 11:00 AM at The Plaza, followed by bunny-related story time at the Sea Girt Library (suitable for all ages); rain date Sunday, March 20 at 1:00 PM.
