13. ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS

- **Coronavirus Information:** Borough Emergency Declaration now in effect; parks and playgrounds are closed; passive recreation areas are open. It is important to have factual up to date information on the coronavirus. The CDC has a "share the facts, stop fear" page which is quite useful in determining what is fact vs. fiction with regard to the coronavirus. It can be accessed at <u>cdc.gov/coronavirus</u>. Another reliable source is the NJ Department of Health at <u>www.nj.gov/health</u> or <u>https://covid19.nj.gov/</u>. Remember , that the best preventive measures are the same as those that are practiced for normal flu and personal hygiene:
 - Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
 - Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
 - Stay home when you are sick.
 - Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
 - Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
 - Follow CDC's recommendations for using a facemask.
 - CDC does not recommend that people who are well wear a facemask to protect themselves from respiratory diseases, including COVID-19.
 - Facemasks should be used by people who show symptoms of COVID-19 to help prevent the spread of the disease to others. The use of facemasks is also crucial for <u>health</u> workers and people who are taking care of someone in close settings (at home or in a health care facility).
 - Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.
- Manasquan First Aid Squad Update Manasquan First Aid Squad has arranged with JFK First Aid Squad to back-up the Squad in the event that MFAS is unable to respond to emergency calls if volunteers are affected by COVID19. They are willing to station a dedicated vehicle in either Manasquan or Sea Girt to respond for the next 60 days or until the crisis abates. The cost of the response will be charged to a patient's insurance carrier based upon rates in effect through JFK's contracts with various insurers, Medicare or Medicaid; patients will be billed for co-pays and/or deductibles as appropriate.
