### 12. ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS

- A. Crescent Parkway Trees (near St. Mark's): The Shade Tree Commission has been monitoring the trees since the initial condition report promulgated by our Forrester in 2017 determined that the trees were compromised (a copy is included with the Agenda). He recently inspected the trees again and found that they are in further decline, with at least one tree considered a "danger" tree requiring immediate removal, a copy of his June 16 message is also attached. The Shade Tree Commission members have also viewed the trees, concur with the determination that they are severely compromised and recommend the removal of all trees this year to minimize the risk to the public in this high-traffic area; a copy of their June 19 message is also attached. Replacement trees will be planted in the fall; per Mr. Brash, recommended replacement tree is white swamp oak, 2-2.5" caliper, 10-12 feet tall. Our tree removal contractor has been notified and we are waiting for a mobilization date.
- **B.** Coronavirus Update: the Governor continues to ease restrictions on gatherings and public activities; non-essential stores are able to open with social distancing observed;
  - a. Baltimore Park field and basketball courts were open on Monday, June 22; the playground remains closed;
  - b. I am happy to report that the Borough filed a timely request with Monmouth County for reimbursement of eligible Phase I expenses under the Coronavirus Relief Fund Program; our application has been reviewed and the payment of \$149,426.54 has been approved.
  - c. Outdoor Dining option Both Emerald Shore, Inc. t/a Harrigan's and CG Jersey, Inc. t/a Fratello's submitted conforming plans as required and were open; there were no issues with their operations. Late on Monday, June 22, CG Jersey, Inc. has submitted a request to utilize Borough property (that is, parking spaces on the east side of The Plaza in front of the existing premises).

## C. Beach:

- a. The Beach is now open full-time through Labor Day:
- b. In compliance with the social distancing requirements of the Governor's Executive Orders, access to the beach may be limited depending if the maximum capacity has been reached; if this is necessary, access may be allowed again as the crowd diminishes;
- c. For their protection and the protection of our staff, beach patrons are urged to wear masks when interacting with our staff and with other patrons;
- d. Daily Badges will be available for purchase from the following locations only during operating hours: the Pavilion at Beacon Boulevard; New York, Philadelphia and Trenton entrances
- e. The Concession will open on or about July 1; eating on the beach remains prohibited;
- D. Public Works Update: The Public Works Committee has met several times to discuss the complaints of residents finding it difficult to follow the sanitation and recycling guidelines that have been approved by the Committee to please maintain clear access to containers on both sanitation and recycling pick-up days – this requires residents to either place their containers at the end of the last vehicle parked in the driveway or to park vehicles on the street on pick-up days. This is especially important on recycling pick-up days as the County has changed its rules and will not accept plastic bags with recyclables requiring our staff to lift the containers to dump into the rear of the scooter. Another issue is the limited area between vehicles parked in driveways and homes that has caused inadvertent damage to residents' vehicles while staff is maneuvering the cans to the scooter. Also, due to injuries to our staff resulting from the inability to access containers without obstruction, the Borough's Negotiating Committee agreed to include this provision (i.e., unobstructed access to containers), to the DPW Collective Bargaining Unit agreement that went into effect on January 1, 2019. The Committee has agreed that these are reasonable requests for the following reasons: 1. to minimize damage to residents' vehicles; 2. reduce potential injury to our staff and 3. reduce the Borough's Workers' Comp claims and costs. Discussion of issue and possible alternative solutions.
- E. Primary Election Update: The Primary Election is scheduled for July 7. Based on new regulations adopted by the Governor, all "active" Republican and Democrat voters will (or should have already received) a mail-in ballot and must vote using this ballot. The ballot must be postmarked by Election Day but will be considered timely and will be counted if it is received by July 14, 2020."Inactive" voters will (or have already) received an Application for a Mail-In Ballot; this must be completed and returned to the County Clerk no later than June 30 in order to receive the ballot. There will be in-person machine voting (hours 6 AM to 8 PM) only for handicapped individuals who will be required to execute an Affidavit affirming that they are unable to vote using the paper mail-in ballot; everyone else will be required to vote using a Provisional Ballot.
